The shared goal of anthropology's various subfields is to contribute to a global picture of the human experience.

The Minor in Anthropology consists of six courses, to be selected as follows:

- 1. An introductory course: ANTH 01 Introduction to Anthropology -or-ANTH 03 - Introduction to Cultural Anthropology.
- 2. One course from each of the following three subfields: Archaeology, Biological Anthropology, and Cultural Anthropology.
- 3. Any two additional anthropology courses.
